Introduction to Radio Controlled Models

Ken Gullberg put together this class at Portland Community College as an introduction to our hobby. With the able help of Hugh Christian the winter term, 16 January through 5 March, covered an introduction to radio controlled modeling with an emphasis on flying models such as airplanes, helicopters and park flyers. The focus of the class centered on how to avoid common mishaps when getting started in this great hobby. The classes were held each Wednesday from 7:00 Pm to 8:50 PM.

Briefly the eight week course covered:

1. Welcome, an overview and history of modeling.
2. Organizations, Academy of Model Aeronautics and other special interest groups.
3. Safety, liability, engines, motors and batteries.
4. Radios including surface, airplane and helicopter.
5. Models, purchase of the first model, park flyer or larger trainer.
6. Building, Repair and Maintenance, material, Kits, repairing damaged airplanes and getting the most out of your investment.
7. Airplanes and Helicopters, trainers, sport aircraft, scale aircraft, mini and micro electric aircraft.
8. Wrap-up, open discussion, building and flying the Delta Dart.

Craig from Tammie's made a guest appearance, brought some models and discussed getting started requirements.
